

Voters need to see that Dan Bishop sides with health insurance companies and big Pharma over regular North Carolinians. Bishop was the only politician from either party to vote against a bipartisan bill that would help patients get more affordable prescription drugs, voted to allow insurance companies to raise prices on life-saving cancer treatments, and even sided with health insurance companies to deny coverage for people with pre-existing conditions. Now Bishop is taking money from drug company lobbyists, and drug company money is helping his campaign.

**Bishop Voted Against Bill That Would Permit Pharmacists To Discuss Lower-Cost Alternative Drugs With Consumers.** “House Bill 466 would permit pharmacists to discuss lower-cost alternative drugs with, and sell lower-cost alternative drugs to, consumers. It would prohibit pharmacy benefits managers from using contract terms to prevent pharmacies from providing store direct delivery services. Pharmacy benefits managers would be prohibited from charging insureds a co-pay that exceeds the total submitted charges by a network pharmacy. Finally, it would allow pharmacy benefits managers to charge pharmacies a fee for costs related to claim adjudication only if the fee was set out in a contract or reported on the remittance advice of the claim.” [[HB 466](#), 4/26/17]

**Bishop Voted Against Requiring Insurance Companies To Offer The Same Coverage And Co-Pays For Oral Chemo Drugs As They Do For Intravenous Chemotherapy.** “The House voted Tuesday night to require insurance companies to offer the same coverage and co-pays for newer, pricier oral chemotherapy drugs as they do for older, less-expensive intravenous chemotherapy drugs. House Bill 306 sponsor Rep. David Lewis, R-Harnett, said that, while orally administered chemotherapy is becoming a treatment standard for many cancers, and in some cases is the only option, out-of-pocket costs for oral chemo drugs under many insurance plans are far higher than for IV drugs.” The bill passed 104-10. **Congressional Leadership Fund Spent \$1.2 Million On Ad Reservations For The NC-09 Special Election In Support Of Dan Bishop.** “Two national Republican groups are pumping nearly \$4 million into Dan Bishop’s 9th District congressional campaign, dramatically ramping up GOP spending and offsetting Democrat Dan McCready’s early fundraising edge. [...] And the Congressional Leadership Fund, a super-PAC tied to Republican House leadership, spent \$1.2 million on ad reservations on Bishop’s behalf. Spokesman Calvin Moore called it the ‘initial part of our investment.’” [Charlotte Observer, [8/2/19](#)]

**Congressional Leadership Fund And Its Sister Organization Have Taken Millions From PhRMA.** “The Congressional Leadership Fund raised \$7.6 million during the first two quarters of 2019, according to filings with the Federal Election Commission. More than \$3.5 million of that total came from the American Action Network, a conservative 501(c)(4) nonprofit established in 2010. [...] The group is also targeting Dan McCready, the Democratic candidate in the special election in North Carolina’s 9th Congressional District. The Charlotte Observer reported Wednesday that the CLF has since made an additional \$1.2 million in ad reservations against McCready, who faces Republican state Sen. Dan Bishop in the September election. Although American Action Network does not disclose its donors, Issue One used nonprofit filings and corporate disclosures to find that the group took \$12 million from Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America, along with large contributions from publicly-traded corporations, since 2009.” [OpenSecrets, [7/31/19](#)]
